NOTES & INFORMATION

STUDENT PICK-UP PROCEDURES – KINDY TO YEAR 6

The safety of your children is our highest priority. Recently, we have noticed an increase in family & friends who are not on the pick-up list, arriving to collect students, particularly in Kindy and Pre-Primary. Please remember that only authorised adults listed on your child's Emergency Contacts (also known as their "pick-up list") are permitted to collect students.

- *During school hours: This applies to all students from Kindy to Year 6.*
- *End-of-day pick-up: This applies specifically to Kindy and Pre-Primary.*

If an individual is not listed as an emergency contact, they are not authorised to collect your child. Student Update Forms will be sent home soon so families can review and update their emergency contacts. If someone collects your child even semi-regularly, adding them to the emergency contact list will make pick-ups more trouble free, smoother and safer for everyone.

To add a new contact at any time, parents/carers can email or phone the school using their own listed contact details, providing the full name, phone number and address of the person they wish to add. We appreciate your cooperation as we continue to prioritise student safety.

Lost Property

We are currently experiencing a high number of items being handed in to Lost Property. To help us return items quickly and efficiently, all student belongings must be clearly labelled with your child's name. This includes hats, jumpers, jackets, lunch boxes, drink bottles, and bags.

Families are also reminded to regularly check the Lost Property box, which is located outside the Administration Building, next to the office door near the lower undercover area.

Compass

Compass is our school's primary communication platform and an important way for families to stay informed and connected with school life.

We strongly encourage all parents and carers to join Compass and check it regularly.

Through Compass, you can:

- *Receive important school notices and newsletters*
- *Stay up to date with events, excursions and reminders*
- *Submit attendance notes and update contact details*
- *Receive timely alerts and notifications from the school*

Being engaged with Compass helps ensure you don't miss important information and allows us to communicate with families quickly and efficiently.
