Room 12 Year 5/6

During our Art program we have been researching Piet Mondrian, a Dutch painter of the 1900's He used lines, squares and rectangles to interpret landscape views. He painted using only the primary colours of red, blue and yellow, and black and white.

Students have been exploring Mondrian's style by creating their own artworks using grids, bold lines, and bright primary colours. They focused on balance, neatness, and creativity—just like Mondrian! Students drew their own interpretation of landscapes from school using these techniques and we have begun painting them.

Room 9 has had a busy and exciting term, filled with learning, creativity, teamwork and opportunities to shine. One of our highlights was hosting the school assembly with the theme "Be Your Own Superhero."

During our assembly, we shared the important message that superheroes are not just found in movies or comic books. Everyday superheroes are all around us. They are people who show kindness, help others, try their best and keep going even when things are difficult. We spoke about the importance of resilience and how we can all be superheroes by making positive choices and supporting the people around us.

Room 9 also enjoyed learning the song "Be Your Own Superhero" and practising the Auslan signs to go with it. The students worked hard to learn the actions and were proud to share their performance with the school community.

This term, we also took time to recognise National Sorry Day. Students learnt about the importance of remembering the Stolen Generations and showing respect, support and sympathy for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples who were affected. Room 9 students wrote thoughtful pledges of recognition, support and sympathy, showing their understanding of the importance of kindness, respect and reconciliation.

We have completed a colourful multi-stage art project. Students began by drawing geckos, then used spray dye to add bright colours. They used objects such as bubble wrap and Lego to print interesting patterns and textures onto their geckos. Students also painted and cut out leaves before putting all the pieces together. The final step was adding big eyes to make the geckos really stand out. The finished artworks look fantastic and show the creativity, patience and effort of Room 9.

Throughout the term, Room 9 has continued to focus on encouraging each other, showing respect and building confidence in our learning. We are very proud of the way the students worked together to prepare for assembly, reflect on National Sorry Day and complete their amazing artwork.
